A BUMP IN THE ROAD

AROUND THE TERRACE

Our traffic officer has informed CTPA that the speed bump that had been on Bimbler (removed late fall) will not be replaced. There are concerns about EMS vehicles being delayed as they drive to Jersey Shore Medical Center. Thank you to all who have responded so far with their feedback. We will be reaching out to the Mayor and Council with a letter to further understand their reasons behind the decision-making process for the removal of the speed bump. We will communicate our residents' strong concerns about the traffic issues and the helpfulness of the speed bump. We will share that letter when it is ready. After emails to Town officials including the Traffic Officer, Sgt. Martinez, regarding the on-going parking violations surrounding Enterprise Car Rental for once, we got a prompt response. Enterprise has received a summons for zoning violations and police have ticketed cars parked along the roads for parking violations. There has been a noticeable improvement with fewer rental cars (and customers) parked along Bingham Avenue. Sgt. Martinez has told us to call the police non-emergency number (732-531-1800) if we notice an uptick in cars parking along Belmont and Bingham and they will send a patrol officer out.

Attached you will find a new Colonial Terrace BLOCK CAPTAIN Map. Block Captains are responsible for delivering CTPA newletters and notices.
